### Intensive Language Stream

Students who choose to participate in the intensive language stream will see rapid improvement in their Indonesian skills. This stream will involve 20 hours of Indonesian classes as well as Indonesian-only periods with support from our management team and hosts. The buddies will also help to ensure that the students experience genuine immersion.

### An Insight and the Contacts for Future Careers

A major goal of this program is to give participants an insight into what it might be like to live in Indonesia. Visits on our previous tours have included government (the Australian Embassy and ASEAN Secretariat), corporate (Indonesia Australia Business Council, ANZ and Air Asia), Indonesian institutions like the Constitutional Court and Judicial Commission, and not-for-profits such as Legal Aid Indonesia, the Centre for Human Rights, the Indonesian Biodiversity Foundation and Oxfam.
