About the Hong Community:

Can you remember when children played with what they could find in their environment and nature? These days, just about all over the world it seems that iPads, Playstations, Xboxes, Nintendo Wii and screen time shape play more than anything else.

In 2005 in West Java, scholar Mohammad Zaini Alif, who had a strong interest in preserving and promoting traditional games, identified this and founded a group called Komunitas Hong. The idea of Komunitas Hong is not only to preserve traditional Indonesian games, but also to re-introduce them to children who may have forgotten them due to the influence of the screen.

OzAsia Festival 2015 will bring members from the West Javan Hong Community to Adelaide to share the making of toys from everyday things, the eating of traditional foods and the playing of universal games in a two hour masterclass designed for teachers.
